

State Officials

For the 2026 midterms, listed below are the state offices that are up for election.

Two of the more well-known candidates running for the Democratic nomination for Florida’s Governor are **David Jolly**, a former Congressional House member, and **Jerry Demings**, Orange County mayor.

Presently, **US Rep Byron Donalds**, who has been endorsed by Trump, and **Paul Renner**, former Florida House Speaker, are two of the more well-known Republicans who are running for Governor. Donalds is a former Florida House Rep and has been the House of Representative for Florida’s 19th Congressional District since 2021. This district serves much of Lee and Collier counties. **Paul Renner** is a former House speaker (2022-2024).

In Florida, state representatives are limited to four consecutive two-year terms. **Toby Overdorf**, currently HR for District 85, is term limited. He was first elected in 2018 and won reelections in 2020, 2022, and 2024. He has announced that he will run for Senate District 31 in 2028. This Senate seat is currently held by **Gayle Harrell**, who will also be term limited and cannot run again for Senate.

Wayne Richter is running for the HD 85 open seat. He is a Democrat.

John Snyder, House Rep District 86, was first elected in 2020 and then re-elected in 2022 and 2024. If re-elected in November 2026, he will be term-limited in 2028 and thus will not be able to run again for House.

Locally, we need good candidates to run for House Rep Districts 85 and 86. All of the positions below are being voted on in the 2026 midterms. The highlighted positions are those in our immediate area.
